PASTOR'S LETTER

Greetings, La Crescenta Presbyterian Church Family & Friends,

Imagine for a moment you are graduating high school, or college. Someone gives you a plaque to hang on your wall with an inspirational Bible verse: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" *Jeremiah 29:11*.

These certainly would be comforting words to someone who is entering a new stage of life. Maybe leaving their parents' house for the first time, or stepping into the real world with a big boy job. Hearing that God's plans for us includes our welfare, and a future and a hope, that sure does sound good!

The problem is, Jeremiah wasn't writing this to high school or college graduates. He was writing to men and women from Judah who had been taken into captivity because of Judah's disobedience. In context, Jeremiah is responding to a false prophet. Judah has been taken into Babylon and in Jeremiah 28:1, an alleged prophet named Hananiah comes along with a "Word from God" in verse 3: "Within two years I am going to bring back to this place all the vessels of the Lord's house, which Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon took away from this place and carried to Babylon. I am

This was great news! Only two more years of captivity, proclaimed this prophet. The problem is, that is was false. He was telling the people what they wanted to hear, but this was not God's true prophet. Jeremiah was God's true prophet, and he responds in 29:4-10, in a letter sent to the elders in exile. "This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those I carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: "Build houses and settle down; plant gardens and eat what they produce. Marry and have sons and daughters; find wives for your sons and give your daughters in marriage, so that they too may have sons and daughters. Increase in number there; do not decrease. Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper." Yes, this is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says: "Do not let the prophets and diviners among you deceive you. Do not listen to the dreams you encourage them to have. They are prophesying lies to you in my name. I have not sent them," declares the Lord. This is what the Lord says: "When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will come to you and fulfill my good promise to bring you back to this place.'

Jeremiah encouraged them to build houses, plant vineyards, get married and make babies so their babies can grow up, get married, and give them grand babies. Why? Because they would actually be in captivity for 70 YEARS!! The other guy was spreading false prophecy. Sure, it sounded better, but it was a lie.

The Bible's One Story to Redeem the Broken World in Jesus

Even though Jeremiah 29 seems pretty bleak, they aren't leaving Babylon anytime soon, and the adults will likely die there, God still promised a future and a hope. Is this simply referring to when the 70 years would be over, and they return to their land? All along the way we get glimpses of hope.

It ought to be crystal clear at this point that Jeremiah 29:11 isn't promising the college graduate an easy life, and a six-figure job right after graduation. What Jeremiah 29:11 teaches us is that even though life may not be what you expected it to be right now. Even if life involves suffering, as it did for those exiles, there is a future and a hope in the midst of this, and His name is Jesus. Jesus is our hope. Jesus is the one who will restore what is broken. Jesus is the one who will restore God's people into a right relationship with God. Jeremiah 29:11 isn't about us. It's not even about Israel or Judah.



Jeremiah 29:11 tells us that Jesus, the righteous branch of David, is our future and hope.

With the hope that we all have in Christ, let me highlight some of the upcoming events that I am looking forward to right here at La Crescenta Presbyterian Church:

- **Pentecost Sunday:** On Sunday, June 8, we will be celebrating Pentecost Sunday, the birth of the Church of Jesus Christ and the giving of the Holy Spirit, with one combined intercultural worship service representing the many cultures present at LCPC. An intercultural potluck will follow the worship service.
- New Sermon Series: On Sunday, June 15, I will be kicking off a new sermon series titled, "The Upside-Down Kingdom of Christ!" In this series, I will be offering a study in the beatitudes and what they mean to us today.
- Middle East Mission Trip: I will be away from May 22 to June 3 with a group of six Pastors and Elders representing San Fernando Presbytery visiting Egypt and Lebanon, connecting with church leaders in both countries and discerning future ministry opportunities and engagement. We covet your prayers.



SPOTLIGHT ON MISSIONS

Hi everyone! I am currently ending my second year at a Christian International School in Germany called Black Forest Academy. This school cares for the families of missionaries who serve Jesus all over the world. I am a resident assistant ("RA") in a dorm of 18 Freshman to Senior girls. I am also on a staff team



with another RA and a set of dorm parents. We work together to care for these students emotionally, physically and spiritually during the school year.

My ministry often looks very mundane. I spend most of my time driving students places, watching sports games and musical recitals, and cooking and cleaning. All of those things I enjoy, but my favorite part of the job is those small golden moments with students. Getting to speak truth over a student who is struggling with insecurity, or getting to counsel a student on how to love a friend well. Sharing Gospel



truth with a student who is doubting, or getting to comfort a girl who has just broken up with her boyfriend. These moments, while sometimes small, feel meaningful. I love that I get to be a beacon of truth in both their mundane and big moments, and point them to Jesus.

Those moments are beautiful and life giving even when it's walking through something hard with a student. There are also moments that I like less. When a student gets angry with me because I had to enforce a rule, or a student is frustrated with something I said, but won't tell me why they're mad. Even though this year has been full of the moments where God has used me as a comfort and truth speaker, there have also been many moments like these as well. Moments that make me feel sad and frustrated and question if I'm doing anything meaningful. Moments where I realise sometimes this job looks more like parenting than being a small group leader. These are moments where I have had to learn the importance of unconditional love, showing up for others even when they don't show up for you. While I have found this impossible in my own strength, I find that when I am connected daily to the vine, God is able to use me to be a constant loving presence in my students' lives even when they are mad at me, or have hard days. I have continually found myself coming back to John 15, that I am a branch and Jesus is the vine, that I will bear fruit if I am connected to Him.

So, this year has been filled with a lot of good, fun, bad and hard, but in all of it, God has given me the opportunity to lean on him and love my students well and unconditionally as He has loved me.
