TRAINING CHRISTIANS TO USE MISSIONARY SKILLS IN AMERICA

I train Christians in America the same skills that I learned as an overseas missionary – to make friends, disciples, and Christ-following groups in their everyday lives, networks, and neighborhoods. I do this through Bridges, which currently provides supportive services for 46 Bridge Leaders, mostly in California but also in five other states. These Bridge Leaders act as domestic "missionaries," bringing to the underserved necessities such as medicine and food, but most importantly, spiritual support.

Bruce spent his adult life anguishing about the death of his beloved older brother: "How could God have let this happen?"

Bridge Leader Larry lives in the same assisted living home as Bruce. Larry has helped Bruce get unstuck from 50 years of grief. Now Bruce is applying to the Peace Corps domestic VISTA program to work on a Native American reservation and has started going to religious services. Larry continues to serve Bruce and the 12 others in his facility.

Eighteen months prior, Larry, struggling with the accumulated impact of mistakes made during his 82 years, was at a rehab center when I, with six broken ribs from a bicycle accident, was wheeled in. One morning I played the song "The Blessing" on my phone. Larry recognized



the words from Numbers 6:24-26 as the blessing always given by his childhood rabbi – 63 years earlier. The Holy Spirit used the opportunity to create a spiritual breakthrough for Larry. Larry says, "I can count few times in my life

Larry says, "I can count few times in my life when I have felt the immense joy of being truly connected to God as I am now through the help of Bridges. Now helping others connect with God is a remarkable reward for me."

When you support Bridges, you empower me to foster Leaders such as Larry as they help others. Lives are being transformed.

Romona Experiences Freedom from Violent Dreams

Romona (name changed, no photo for privacy) had terrible dreams. She thought they were from Spirits, showing her what happened to her mother at the hands of her father. I sat down with her and showed her from Scripture that "Every good and perfect gift comes down from the Father of Lights." Romona agreed to an experiment. The two of us prayed together for God to allow only dreams that reveal truth

and come from the most-High God who gives good gifts to his children. I helped her to re-affirm her loyalty to the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, disavowing any loyalty to any lesser Spirit. And I taught her how to do this by herself. "I have no more terrible dreams," says Romona. Pray for Romona, because this is only a good first step.

Bridges seeks to *add* 25 to 50 new Leaders in 2024. Each Leader, including me, disciples on average four new people each year who are outside the culture of existing churches. Over the past 10 years, through Bridges, thousands have come to Christ, 12 new churches have started and over 26 micro nonprofits, all of them changing lives and improving local communities. PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear La Crescenta Presbyterian Church Family & Friends,

It's a New Year, and a new beginning! New beginnings can be both exciting and intimidating. They represent a chance to start fresh and make positive changes in our lives, but they also require us to let go of the familiar and step into the unknown.

As Christians, we can find hope and strength in knowing that God is with us in all things, including the new beginnings we face. In Isaiah 43:19, the Lord says, "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" God is constantly at work in our lives, creating new opportunities and possibilities for us. As I think about those new opportunities and possibilities God offers LCPC, let me just highlight a few as we embark on this New Year.

Tuesday Bible Study: This is a NEW Bible Study opportunity that I am offering to LCPC Family and the community at large. to the person of Jesus Christ.




